Project Background

Overall Project Purpose:

To develop a blueprint for future improvements for Houghton Park to realize the vision of feasible, equitable, accessible, safe, and functional park facilities.





Project Background

- New Master Plan for Houghton Stachowski Park (Houghton Park).
- One of eight City of Buffalo park master plans funded by the American Rescue Plan.
- Will include recommendations for rehabilitation of existing facilities as well as improvements to attract new and serve existing park users.
- Big-picture approach to defining priorities for updated and new facilities for Houghton Park including Houghton Conservation Area also known as the Woods and the Fields.
- For the purposes of the Master Plan, Houghton Conservation Area is considered part of Houghton Park. Buffalo Niagara River Land Trust is the perpetual steward of the Conservation Area and the City of Buffalo, which owns it, is responsible for facilities within this area.





Houghton Park History

- Dedicated in 1925 and named for Frederick M. Houghton, archeologist and BPS administrator. His efforts established both the park and the school. Renamed Houghton Stachowski Park to honor Stanley J. Stachowski, City Parks Commissioner, 1965-1973.
- Many of the dead-end streets south of Clinton Street once ended at the Buffalo River! The original riverbed was filled in to straighten the river.
- The Conservation Area (the Woods) was a landfill from 1930 until 1973.
- In 1945, John E. Brent, Buffalo's first Black architect, designed an addition to the park that included a vision for what became the Woods.
- The 1956 Polish Falcons of America Quadrennial Convention was held in Buffalo. The Zlot (field meet) was held in Houghton Park. Olympic champion Stella Walsh (Stanisława Walasiewicz) ran.









John Brent, AIA

During his long and distinguished career, he also designed the wrought iron gates at the Buffalo Zoo.





Houghton Park Today

- Houghton Park is a recreation and social anchor of the proud historic Kaisertown Neighborhood.
- At nearly 60 acres, Houghton is one of Buffalo's largest parks. Only Delaware Park, South Park, Cazenovia Park, Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Centennial Park, and Tifft Farms Nature Preserve are larger.
- It was actually renamed Stachowski Park but the name seems never to have stuck. So it's Houghton Stachowski Park, or just plain Houghton Park.
- A community garden maintained by the Kaisertown Friends Association is in the park behind the school.
- Get Every Kid in the Game co-ed youth flag football league is based in Houghton Park.





Plan Houghton Park!

The Master Plan project includes:

- Assessment of existing facilities including splash pads, play courts, athletic fields, playground, trails, and multi-use paths, picnic areas, open spaces, conservation area, shelters, etc.
- It also includes assessment of the park's entrances and exits, parking areas, the security of the park perimeter, and lighting.
- A list of priorities for park improvements will be developed during the plan. Not all of these can be funded right away. A list of priority projects will be developed to guide funding decisions in the future.
- The pool building will be analyzed for building and environmental conditions as part of the project. This analysis will be used to support future investments, but will not be included in the improvements planned for this phase of the work.





Plan Houghton Park!

The project will take place in phases:

- During the *schematic design* phase, we imagine what the park could look like in 20 years that's beginning now!
 - The schematic design phase will result in sketches and renderings of the future park that will be reviewed by the public and approved by the City of Buffalo, creating the Houghton Park Master Plan.
- During the *design development* phase, priority projects from the Master Plan will be advanced to landscape architecture, architecture and engineering documents, including cost estimates.
 - These will also be presented to the public for comment and the City for approval
 - The projects approved for immediate funding will advance to construction drawings and bidding in order for construction to start in 2024

Some Survey Results so far

- Most respondents live right in Kaisertown and more than half visit Houghton Park at least a couple of times a month.
- Respondents' likes: walking paths, open spaces, playground and that the park is close to home.
- What they'd most like to change: Better maintenance and upkeep, updated facilities.
- The top characteristics respondents said were very important:
 - Quality and maintenance of sports facilities (92%)
 - Park and playground safety (91%)
 - Support facilities like washrooms and drinking fountains (86%)
 - Landscaping and appearance (86%)
 - Lighting (84%)

Conservation Area Vision Plan Process

- Earlier in 2023 the Buffalo Niagara River Land Trust worked with the community to generate a Vision Plan for the conservation area over the course of four community workshops.
- That Vision Plan will be rolled into the overall Park Master Plan, and of course community voices are welcome to share their thoughts now to shift or add to that vision.
- If you participated in that process, you'll notice some of the activities will be part of this master plan process as well. We'll be looking now at the entirety of the park.

Conservation Area Update

- Spring of 2023, Waterkeeper and the Land Trust hosted a clean up day to remove litter and dumping
- Buffalo Niagara River Land Trust has been awarded a \$50,000 grant to help with the removal of concrete and brick debris that remains in the natural area from the landfill era. That work will commence this fall.
 - That grant also allows us to host a Nature Inspiration Day on Sat Sept 23 with family friendly nature inspired activities
 - The event is part of the grant and is to continue interest and championship of the Conservation Area
